THE MIDDLE SEA is a journey along the shores of the Mediterranean costs, the cities, the inhabitants, the territories and the relationships that have been built between them.

Moving both vertically and horizontally between the Mediterranean and Europe, between East and West, the journey consists of a round trip, an infinite series of arrivals, contacts, migration, contamination and transmission. The effects of globalisation and the changing geopolitical scenario have led to phenomena of rapid transformation in the sense of places, threatening delicate social and environmental equilibria. The abandonment of traditional ways of life and the growth of new megalopolises, the increasing migratory flows and the tourist resorts, the ancient trade routes and the great infrastructures, the complex and hybrid role of the city and the great Mediterranean ports, with their various cycles of both work and play, their social components, the openings and connections to the surrounding territory as well as their ties with the continental dimension behind them.

<u>Istanbul</u>, <u>Beirut</u>, <u>Nicosia</u>, <u>Tel Aviv</u>, <u>Alexandria</u>, <u>Tangeri</u>, <u>Palermo</u>, <u>Barcelona</u>, <u>Marseilles</u>, <u>Athens:</u> these are just some of the cities involved in the project, and which all look onto the Middle Sea. Water has always played a fundamental role in the everyday lives of these coastal towns, influencing their colours and smells, activities and relationships: a precious resource and a point of reference for both the cities and their inhabitants.

THE MIDLE SEA has been conceived and produced during the decade of the international project GOING PUBLIC (2003-2013), a program to valorize cultures, practices and territories in the Mediterranean and Balkan area.
